

The Tute ESOL Everyday English Scheme of Learning is designed for learners who have recently arrived in the UK with no, or very little prior learning of the English language.

Typically, students will be waiting to be allocated a school place, and may be studying in their accommodation or a community setting. Recognising that students may not have a laptop, the course caters to students accessing lessons by mobile phone. There is a strong emphasis on acquisition of everyday, spoken English for use in the community and in school, when a place becomes available. Topics will include an introduction to family, numbers, colours, names of common foods, places in town and shopping at a market. Students will learn to recognise and answer some simple questions about themselves. They will learn to recognise and respond appropriately to offers and social language.

In each lesson, there will be a strong emphasis on revising and building on previous learning, and building learners' confidence to use basic spoken phrases in the community.
